Chapter - 1 Introduction

The Need for Gender Disaggregated Data

ender is an important criterion for **7** socio-cultural analysis. The lack of sex-disaggregated data and statistics that make gender inequalities visible, especially around issues pertinent to inclusive and sustainable development has resulted in an incomplete picture of women's economic, political and social situations in the State. Further, with rapid acceleration of economic and social progression of society, evidence based information on gender has become more pertinent so as to ensure social justice between men and women. Access to gender statistics and disaggregated data is vital for formulation and assessment of government's policies so as to bridge the gender gap disparities.

Objectives of Gender Statistics

- Enhance Gender statistical awareness among various stakeholders so as to ensure that the production of data is tailored to the needs of policy-makers.
- Promote use of gender statistics to advocate for policy change.
- Setting up reliable and comparable indicators to measure progress on gender equality over a period of time.
- Help develop a more inclusive gender based development strategy.

At a time when many countries are making extra efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030, the importance of gender statistics needs to be re-emphasized as a tool by which SDG targets can be achieved. Certainly, disadvantages that women and girls may face in various social, political and economic contexts are a major source of inequality, which is correlated with unequal human development. Sex-disaggregation of data is thus required for achieving SDG targets, addressing issue on persisting gender inequalities, generating evidence based policy programmes as well as setting and monitoring acceptable relevant benchmarks.

Status of Women under Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030

The effort towards gender equality and empowerment of women was recognized with the onset of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and got a big boost with the focus of SDGs on gender equality and women's rights. Goals 5 of the SDGs pertain to achieving gender equality and empower all women and girls. Status of women encompasses diverse domains and efforts to move towards equality and empowerment requires that information/indicators are available in diverse forms. Details of Goal 5

Targets are-

- 5.1 End all forms of discrimination against all women and girls everywhere.
- 5.2 Eliminate all forms of violence against all women and girls in the public and private spheres, including trafficking and sexual and other types of exploitation.
- 5.3 Eliminate all harmful practices, such as child, early and forced marriage and female genital mutilation.
- 5.4 Recognize and value unpaid care and domestic work through the provision of public services, infrastructure and social protection policies and the promotion of shared responsibility within the household and the family as nationally appropriate.
- 5.5 Ensure women's full and effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership at all levels of decision making in political, economic and public life.
- 5.6 Ensure universal access to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights as agreed in accordance with the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development and the Beijing Platform for Action and the outcome documents of their review conferences.
- 5.7 Undertake reforms to give women equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to ownership and control over land and other forms of property, financial services, inheritance and natural resources, in accordance with national laws.

- 5.8 Enhance the use of enabling technology, in particular information and communications technology, to promote the empowerment of women.
- 5.9 Adopt and strengthen sound policies and enforceable legislation for the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls at all levels.

IMPORTANT CONSTITUTIONAL AND LEGAL PROVISIONS FOR WOMEN IN INDIA AND NAGALAND

The principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles. The Constitution not only grants equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women. Within the framework of a democratic polity, our laws, development policies, Plans and programmes have aimed at women's advancement in different spheres. India has also ratified various international conventions and human rights instruments committing to secure equal rights of women. Key among them is the ratification of the Convention on Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) in 1993.

1. CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS

The Constitution of India not only grants equality to women but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women for neutralizing the cumulative socio economic, education and political disadvantages faced by them. Fundamental Rights, among others, ensure equality before the law and equal protection of law; prohibits discrimination against any citizen on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth, and guarantee equality of opportunity to all citizens in matters relating to employment. Articles 14, 15, 15(3), 16, 39(a), 39(b), 39(c) and 42 of the Constitution are of specific importance in this regard.

Constitutional Privileges

- (i) Equality before law for women (Article 14)
- (ii) The State not to discriminate against any citizen on grounds only of religion, race, caste, sex, place of birth or any of them (Article 15 (i))
- (iii) The State to make any special provision in favour of women and children (Article 15 (3))
- (iv) Equality of opportunity for all citizens in matters relating to employment or appointment to any office under the State (Article 16)
- (v) The State to direct its policy towards securing for men and women equally the right to an adequate means of livelihood (Article 39(a)); and equal pay for equal work for both men and women (Article39 (d))
- (vi) To promote justice, on a basis of equal opportunity and to provide free legal aid by suitable legislation or scheme or in any other way to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of

- economic or other disabilities (Article 39 A)
- (vii) The State to make provision for securing just and humane conditions of work and for maternity relief (Article 42)
- (viii) The State to promote with special care the educational and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people and to protect them from social injustice and all forms of exploitation (Article 46)
- (ix) The State to raise the level of nutrition and the standard of living of its people (Article 47)
- (x) To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India and to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women (Article 51(A) (e))
- (xi) Not less than one-third (including the number of seats reserved for women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes) of the total number of seats to be filled by direct election in every Panchayat to be reserved for women and such seats to be allotted by rotation to different constituencies in a Panchayat (Article 243 D(3))
- (xii) Not less than one- third of the total number of offices of Chairpersons in the Panchayats at each level to be reserved for women (Article 243 D (4))
- (xiii) Not less than one-third (including the number of seats reserved for women belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes) of the total

- number of seats to be filled by direct election in every Municipality to be reserved for women and such seats to be allotted by rotation to different constituencies in a Municipality (Article 243 T (3))
- (xiv) Reservation of offices of Chairpersons in Municipalities for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and women in such manner as the legislature of a State may by law provide (Article 243 T (4))

2. LEGAL PROVISIONS

To uphold the Constitutional mandate, the State has enacted various legislative measures intended to ensure equal rights, to counter social discrimination and various forms of violence and atrocities and to provide support services especially to working women. Although women may be victims of any of the crimes such as 'Murder', 'Robbery', 'Cheating' etc, the crimes, which are directed specifically against women, are characterized as 'Crime against Women'. These are broadly classified under two categories.

- (1) The Crimes Identified Under the Indian Penal Code (IPC)
 - (i) Rape (Sec. 376 IPC)
 - (ii) Kidnapping & Abduction for different purposes (Sec. 363-373)
 - (iii) Homicide for Dowry, Dowry Deaths or their attempts (Sec. 302/304-BIPC)
 - (iv) Torture, both mental and physical (Sec. 498-A IPC)
 - (v) Molestation (Sec. 354 IPC)

- (vi) Sexual Harassment (Sec. 509 IPC)
- (vii) Importation of girls (up to 21 years of age)
- (2) The Crimes identified under the Special Laws (SLL)

Although all laws are not gender specific, the provisions of law affecting women significantly have been reviewed periodically and amendments carried out to keep pace with the emerging requirements. Some acts have special provisions to safeguard women and their interests like

- (i) The Family Courts Act, 1954
- (ii) The Special Marriage Act, 1954
- (iii) The Hindu Marriage Act, 1955
- (iv) The Hindu Succession Act, 1956 with amendment in 2005
- (v) Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956
- (vi) The Maternity Benefit Act, 1961 (Amended in 1995)
- (vii) Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961
- (viii) The Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971
- (ix) The Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1976
- (x) The Equal Remuneration Act, 1976
- (xi) The Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006
- (xii) The Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 1983
- (xiii) Indecent Representation of Women (Prohibition) Act, 1986
- (xiv) Commission of Sati (Prevention) Act, 1987
- (xv) The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005

3. SPECIAL INITIATIVES FOR WOMEN IN INDIA

- (i) National Commission for Women: In January 1992, the Government set-up this statutory body with a specific mandate to study and monitor all matters relating to the constitutional and legal safeguards provided for women, review the existing legislation to suggest amendments wherever necessary, etc.
- (ii) Reservation for Women in Local Self Government: The 73rd Constitutional Amendment Acts passed in 1992 by Parliament ensure one-third of the total seats for women in all elected offices in local bodies whether in rural areas or urban areas.
- (iii) The National Plan of Action for the Girl Child (1991-2000): The plan of Action

- is to ensure survival, protection and development of the girl child with the ultimate objective of building up a better future for the girl child. National Policy for Children-2013 was adopted by the Government of India on 26th April 2013. National Plan of Action for Children 2016 is in Draft Format.
- (iv) National Policy for the Empowerment of Women, 2001: The Department of Women & ChildDevelopment in the Ministry of Human Resource Development has prepared a "National Policy for the Empowerment of Women" in the year 2001. The goal of this policy is to bring about the advancement, development and empowerment of women. National Policy for the Empowerment of Women, 2016 is under draft stage.

Women's Empowerment and Initiatives for the State of Nagaland

- (I) The Nagaland State Commission for Women is a statutory body, constituted by the State Government under the Nagaland Women Commission Act 2006 to investigate and examine all matters relating to Women issues and also to safeguard the women provisions which was provided for women under the Constitution and other laws.
- (ii) The Naga Mothers Association (NMA) is a prominent civil society organization formed by women during 1984 in response to the drug and alcohol addiction ravaging Nagaland. Since its inception, NMA has consistently tried to address problems of conflicts, peace building and substance abuse by creating a platform for dialogue that brings desperate voices together. During the 1980s and 1990s, NMA stepped in and voiced their concern against fratricidal killing and violence that tore Nagaland apart. Over the past few years, NMA has been fighting for women rights and empowerment in the state.

(iii) Maternity Leave Benefit

The State Government through an Office Memorandum, dated- 3rd April, 2017 has enhanced the existing ceiling of 90 days of maternity Leave under CSS (Leave) Rules, 1972 to 180 days for the State Government Female Employees.

Demographic Statistics

Demography is usually defined as the study of human population - its size, growth, density, distribution etc. A correct understanding of population dynamics, in relation to fertility, mortality and migration is vital for effective health policy and planning. 2.22. Gender wise Farming population in all Districts

Nagaland's population during 2001 was 19.90 lakhs which decreased to 19.78 lakhs in 2011 census. Census 2011 comprises of 9.53 lakhs females and 10.24 lakhs males. The ratio of female to male population stands at 48:52 as per census 2011. Percentage share of female population in rural areas is 48.46% and 47.60% in urban areas. The decadal growth rate of population in 2001 was 64.53 % which drastically declined to - 0.58 % during 2011. The decadal growth rate of female population for the corresponding years was 65.93 % and 1.16 % respectively.

Sex Ratio

- In 2001, the sex ratio (number of females per 1000 males) was 900 which increased to 931 during 2011 census. Sex ratio as per 2011 census for rural and urban areas is 940 and 908 respectively. (Refer table no. 2.1)
- At the district level, Zunheboto has the highest sex ratio of 976 followed by Wokha (968) and the lowest sex ratio is reported at Mon district (899) and Longleng (905). Over the last 40 years (post statehood) considerable improvement in sex ratio is observed in District of Kohima (22.27%), Mokokchung (10.91%) and Dimapur (7.61%). However, the sex ratio has worsened in the districts of Peren (-3.28%), Wokha (-1.22%) and Mon (-0.44%). (Refer table no.2.3)

As per 2011 census, the sex ratio for Girl Child (0-19) age group was 937, 957 for the productive age group (15-45) and 875 for age group (60+). The sex ratio in the economically active age group (15-59 years) was 936. (Refer table no.2.6)

Child Population

As per census 2011, child population (0-6 years) was 291071, out of which 149785 were male and 141286 were female. The share of child population to total population is 14.71%. Child sex ratio (0-6 years) during 2001 was 964 which declined to 943 in 2011. Child sex ratio as per 2011 census in the rural and urban areas is 933 and 973 respectively. (Refer table no.2.4 & 2.5)

Population by age group

➤ Under population by age group, it is seen that age group of 0-9 has the highest percentage of population i.e. 21.75%. Under this age group, child female population was 21.85% female and child male population was 21.66%. The age group of 10-14 comes second at 12.57% of which 12.52% are female and 12.61% are male. The age group of 80+ comes at the bottom with 0.70% of which 0.67% are female and 0.72% are male. (Refer table no.2.7)

Marital Status in Age Group

Female population in the age group of less than 14 years who never married was 58.94%, 0.50 % for currently

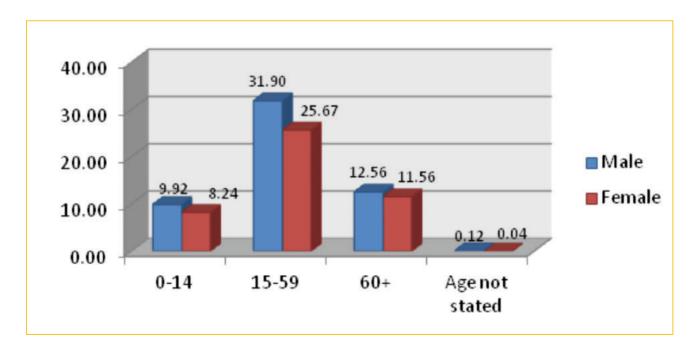
married and 0.26 % for Widowed/Divorced/ Separated. The corresponding status for the age group of 15-29 was 35.55 %, 28.18% and 7.45 % respectively. For the age group of 30-59 and 60+ who never married was 4.90% and 0.53% respectively, currently married was 63.98% and 7.29 % respectively and Widowed/Divorced/Separated was 52.34% and 39.89% respectively. (Refer table no.2.8)

Disabled Persons

As per Census 2011 report, Nagaland has 29631 (1.5% to total population) numbers of disabled persons, of which 16148 are male and 13483 are female. In the categories of age group, maximum number of disabled are in the age group of 15-59 i.e. 31.90 % of male and 25.67 % female. Percentage distributions of disabled population to total disabled population are given in the diagram below. (for detail refer table no.2.9)

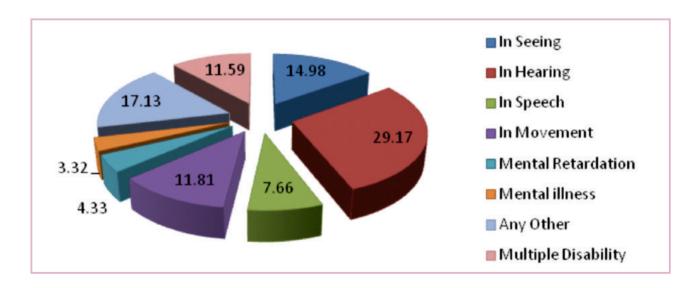

In the types of disability, there were 3933 females with hearing disability, 2020 female with seeing disability, 1593 females in movement disability,

1033 females in speech and 584 in mental retardation. Percentage share of each type to total female disability is shown in the diagram below. (for detail refer table no.2.10)

In the educational level, 8563 no. or 63.51% of female disabled are illiterate and 4920 no. or 36.49% of females are literate as against 50.56% of illiterate male and 49.44% of literate male. (for detail refer table no.2.13)

Births & Deaths

During the year 2021, total number of births registered was 64988, out of which 32594 (50.15%) were female and 32394(49.85%) were male. District of Dimapur registered the highest with 11275 female and 10853 male which is followed

by Mon with 9004 female and 8719 male. During the same year, 2698 numbers of males and 1082 numbers of female deaths were registered. Only three infant deaths were reported during the given year. (Refer table no.2.14-C).

Deaths by Age Group and Sex, 2021

As seen from the given table, percentage of deaths was higher in the age group of 70 and above. It was 22.72 % for male and 22.27 % for female in the age group of 70+.

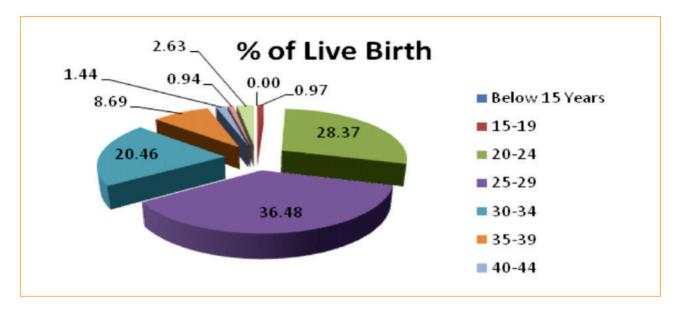

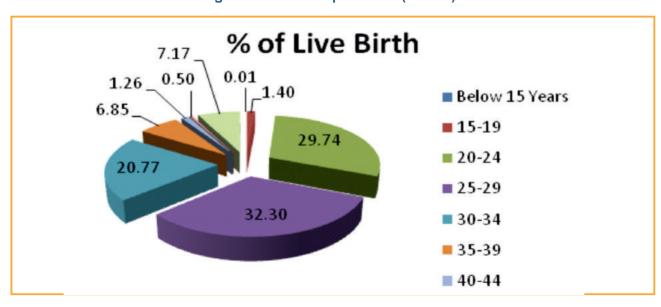


Percentage of live births by birth order and age of mother during 2021 in urban areas

Live birth order vis-a~-vis age of mother in pie chart (Urban)



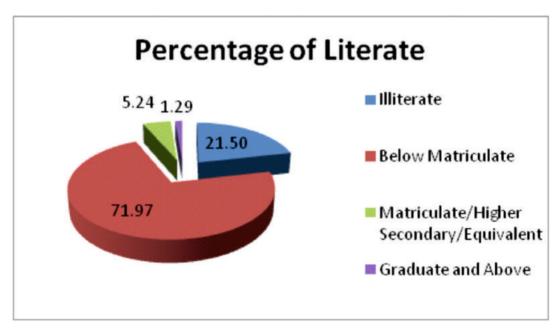

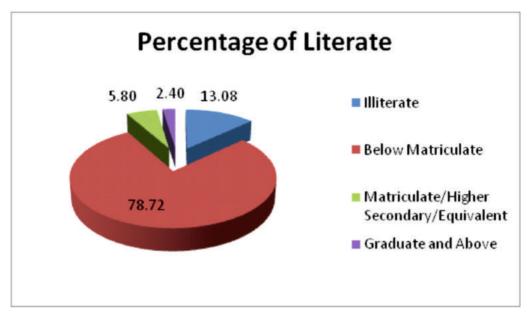
Representation in pie chart

Infant Mortality Rate (IMR)

As per national health profile of India 2021, the Infant Mortality (per 1000 live births) of Nagaland during 2019 was 3 indicating better IMR as compared to national level at 30. The state IMR for male was 3 and 2 for female.

Births by Type of Delivery Attention, 2021

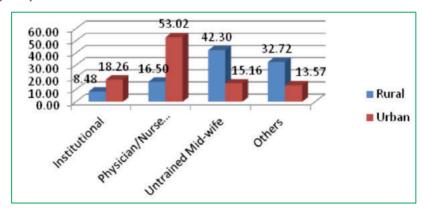
In rural areas, delivery attention by untrained mid-wife and others plays a dominant role unlike urban areas where delivery mostly takes place in institutional or by Physician/Nurse and Trained Mid-wife. As seen in the table below, institutional delivery in rural areas is only 8.48% as compared to 18.26% in urban areas. On the other hand, delivery by untrained mid-wife in rural areas is 42.30% as compared to 15.16% in urban areas. Districts of Dimapur and Kohima have higher Proportion of Births attended by skilled health Professionals during 2021. Whereas, districts of Wokha, Tuensang and Mokokchung have lower proportion of Births attended by skilled health Professionals. These imbalances amongst the districts need to be rectified by the policy makers. (For detail refer table no. 3.1 & 3.4)

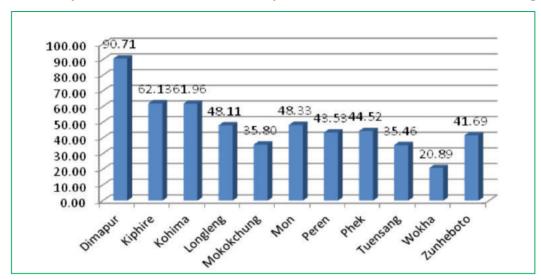

Type of Delivery Representation in Chart



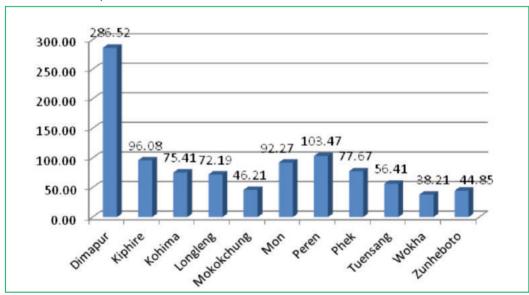


District Wise Proportion of Births Attended By Skilled Health Professionals during 2021

District wise Antenatal Care Coverage

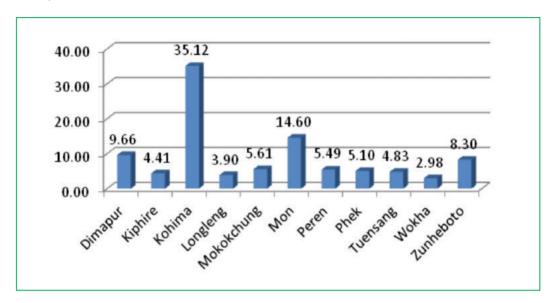
Antenatal care is important during pregnancy as it ensures that the pregnant women and her fetus are in best possible health. District of Dimapur with 286.52% has the highest antenatal care followed by Peren(103.47%) and Kiphire(96.08%). On the other hand, district of Wokha(38.21%), Zunheboto(44.85%) and Mokokchung(46.21%) reported lower antenatal care. (Refer table no. 3.5)



Family Planning & Contraceptive Prevalence during 2021

There were 7543 contraceptive users among women and men who are married or in union in aged group of (15-49) in the state. Districts of Kohima (35.12%) & Mon (14.60%) reported highest contraceptive users amongst all districts. (For detail refer table no.3.7)





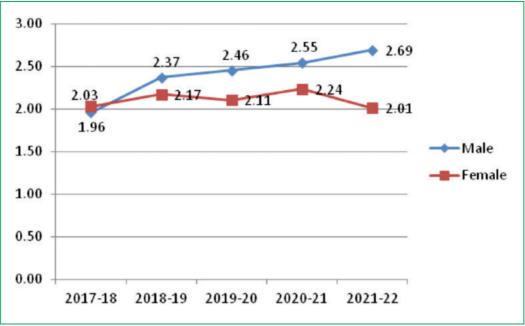
AIDS/HIV

As reported by Nagaland State AIDS control Society (NSACS) during 2021-22, 29702 number of male clients and 33025 number of female clients (including pregnant women) were tested for HIV at ICTC Centers, of which 800 males and 665 females were tested HIV +ve. As seen in the given table, the percentage of HIV +ve is steadily increasing over the years. Further, during the same year 12124 pregnant women were tested during Antenatal Check-ups (ANC) out of which 124 tested HIV +ve. (Refer table no.3.9 & 3.10)

Access to Anti-Retroviral Drugs

➤ During 2019-20, 4607 number of males had availed anti-retroviral drugs as compared to 4580 number of females and 7 number of transgender. Over the years, number of persons having access to anti-retroviral drugs has increased. During 2021-22, 4978 males and 5032 females and 7 number of transgender has availed anti-retroviral drugs. (Refer table no. 3.11)

National Family Health Survey 2019-20 (NFHS-5)

As per NFHS-5, Sex ratio (females per 1000 males) is 1007 and Child Sex Ratio recorded 945. The Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) and under five mortality rate (U5MR) were 23.4 and 33 respectively. (for detail refer table no. 3.12)

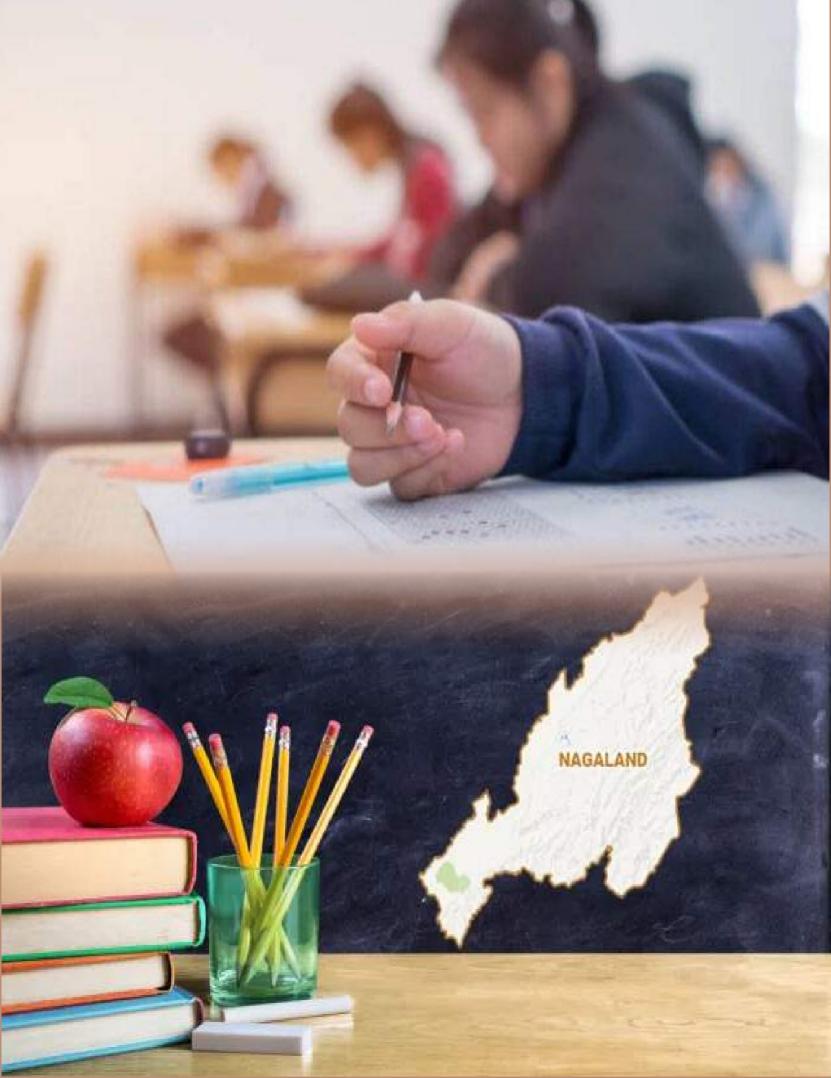

Some of the Important Findings Literacy Rate

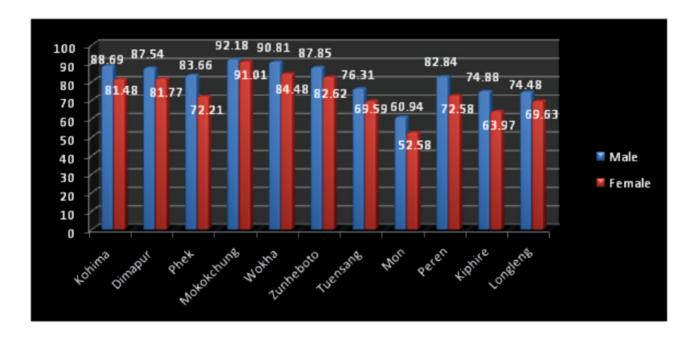
- As per Census 2011, the literacy rate of Nagaland was 79.6% and particularly the literacy rate for females and males were 76.1% and 82.8% respectively. During the last decade (2001), the literacy rate was 66.6% with female literacy rate of 61.5% and male literacy rate of 71.2%. The female literacy rate has increased by 14.6% over the last 10 years.
- Amongst the district, Mokokchung has the highest literacy rate of 91.6 % with male literacy rate of 92.2 % and female literacy rate of 91 %. The lowest literacy rate at 57% was recorded in Mon district i.e. Male- 60.9%, Female- 52.6%.

The gap in literacy rates of males and females is low in the districts of Mokokchung, Zunheboto and Longleng and high in the districts of Phek, Kiphire and Peren.

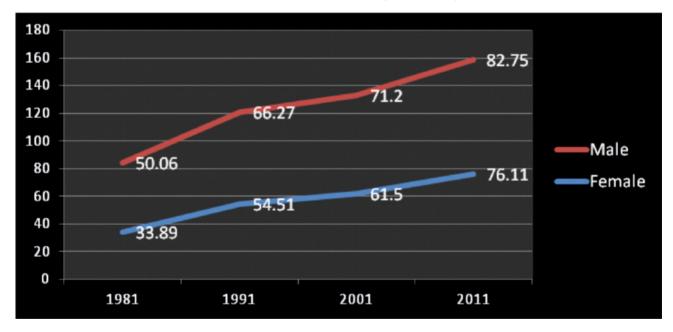

There has been a steady increase in the literacy rate over the years. During 2001, the literacy rate of female was 61.5 % which increased to 76.11% in 2011. In case of male, literacy rate was 71.2 % in 2001 which increased to 82.75%. Although, the state female literacy rate-76.11% is much higher than the national literacy rate-64.6% there still exists a gender literacy gap of 6.64%. (Refer table no. 4.2 & 4.3)

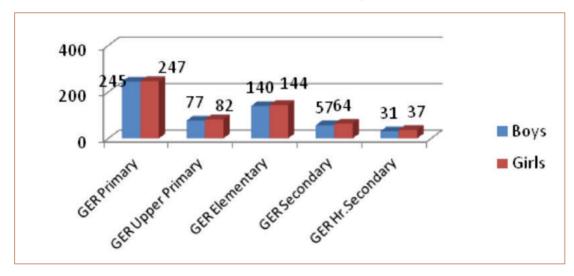

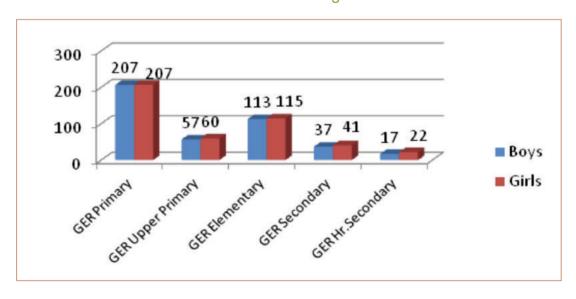
During 2020 -21, the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for General Education at primary level for females and males were 247% and 245% respectively, GER for upper primary were 82% for females and 77% for males, at elementary level it was 144% for females and 140% for males and at secondary level and higher secondary level, it was 64% females and 57% males and 37% females and 31% males respectively. As seen from the given chart, the GER of female is slightly higher than male in all the different levels. (Refer table no. 4.8)





The Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) in Schools at Primary level during 2020-21 was 207% for both females and males. 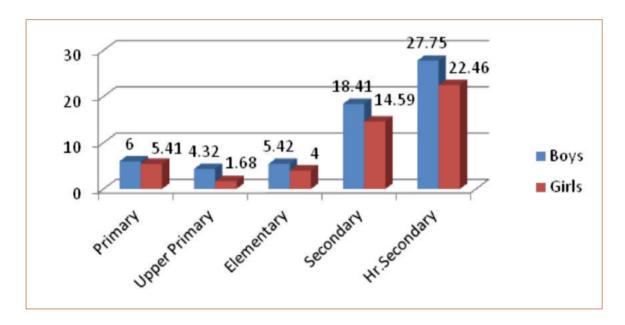
Gender Parity Index in the state was 0.95 and 1.01 for primary and upper primary respectively and 0.97 for elementary section. (Refer table no.4.10)

During the year 2020-21, the Gender Parity Index for Government Teachers in Nagaland is 1.11 for primary level, 0.89 for upper primary and 1.06 for secondary & higher secondary level. Districts of Dimapur, Kohima, Mokokchung and Tuensang have higher female teachers per 100 male teachers. (Refer table no. 4.11)

As per UDISE +, drop-out rates for boys and girls in the primary level during the year 2020-21 was 6.00 % and 5.41% respectively, at upper-primary level it was 4.32% for boys and 1.68% for girls, at elementary level it was 5.42% boys and 4.09% girls and at secondary level it was 18.41% boys and 14.59% girls. Dropout rate at higher secondary registered the highest. It was 27.75% for boys and 22.46% for girls. It is seen that dropout rate for boys is much higher than girls in all the categories. 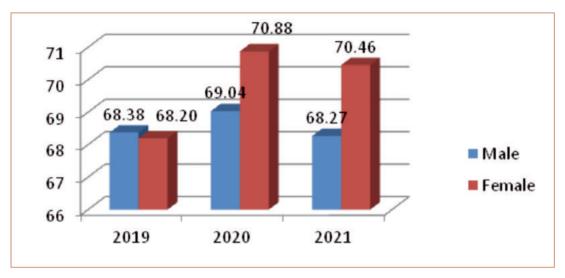
Gender wise Dropout Rate in Nagaland 2020-21

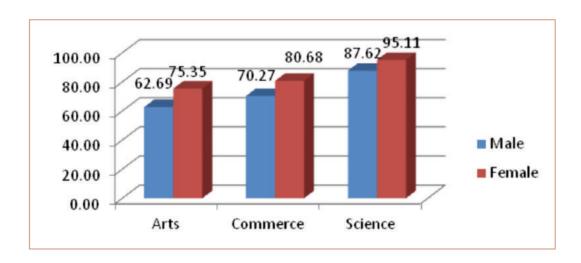




Result of Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) Examination.

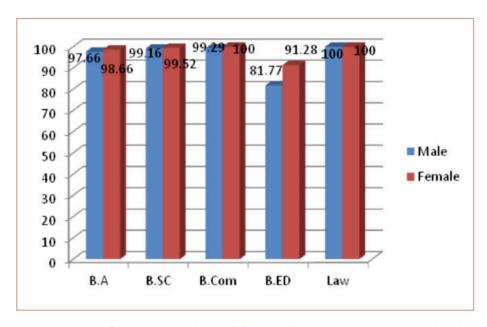

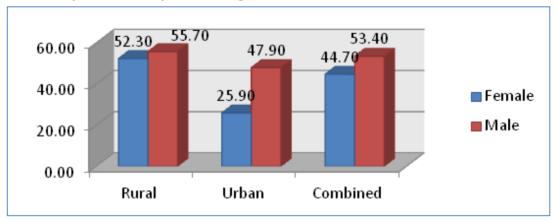

Some Important Findings Workforce Participation Rate

Census 2011 shows that the combined workforce participation rate of Nagaland is 44.7 % for females and 53.4% for males. While there is no much gap between male (55.7%) and female (52.3%)

participation in the rural areas, there is a considerable male-female gap in the urban areas (female -25%, male- 47%). Districts of Mon, Zunheboto, Longleng and Peren have the maximum number of female workforce participation rate in rural areas and in the urban areas Peren district has the highest female workforce participation rate. (Refer table no. 5.1)

Workforce Participation Rate by Sex in Nagaland, 2011 Census

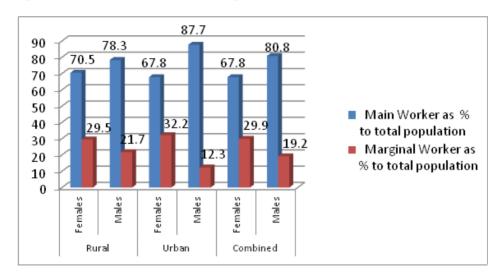


Main and Marginal Workers

As per census 2011 report, main female workers (combined) in the state constitute 67.8 % of the total main worker population which is higher than national level percentage of 59.6 %, while males constitute 80.8 % which is slightly lower to the national level of 82.3%. In the marginal worker category, female workers constitute 29.9 % as compared to the male of 19.2 %. The percentage of female marginal workers in the state is very low as compared to the national level which has 40.4 %. (Refer table no. 5.3)

Main & Marginal Workers in Percent (Nagaland)

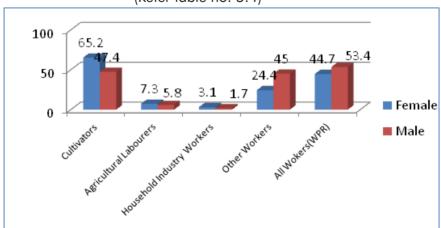
Categories of Workers

In the categories of workers, it is interesting to note that the percentage of female cultivators (65.2%) and agricultural labourers (7.3%) are more than male cultivators (47.4%) and agricultural labourers (5.8%) respectively. On the other hand, females have less percentage of workers (24.4%) in other workers category as compared to males which stands at 45%. (Refer table no. 5.4)

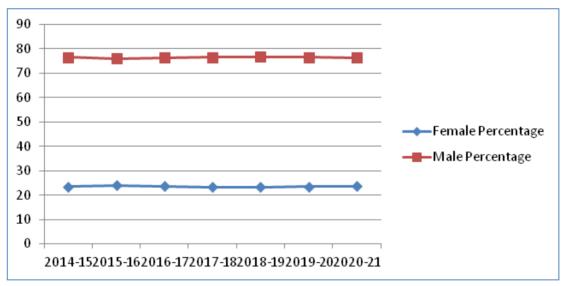


As per 6th Economic Census 2013, DES, 24.96 % of female employees are engaged in agricultural activities and 33.39 % were engaged in non-agricultural activities as compared to their corresponding male counterparts which stood at 75.04 % for agricultural activities and 66.61 % for non-agricultural activities respectively. 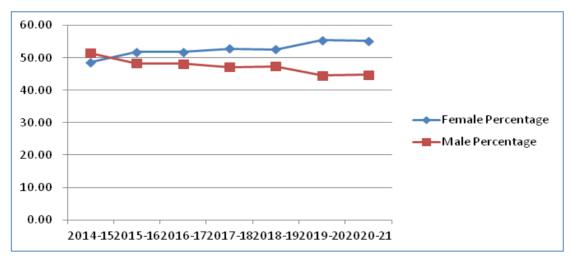
Sector Wise Women Employment

Number of women employed in organized sectors has been steadily increasing over the years. During 2005-06, 18.23% and 35.02% of women were engaged in public and private sector which has increased to 23.68% and 55.24% respectively during 2020-21. It is seen from the chart that women are ahead of men in private sector employment but are largely lagging behind in public sector employment. During 2020-21, female employment constituted 25.75% of the total employment. Tuensang/Kiphire District Employment Exchange Centre with 29.95% female registrations has the highest percentage of female employees in public sector and Kohima with 63.66% has the highest percentage of female employees in private sector. Private Sector Women Employment in Nagaland from 2014-15 to 2020-21



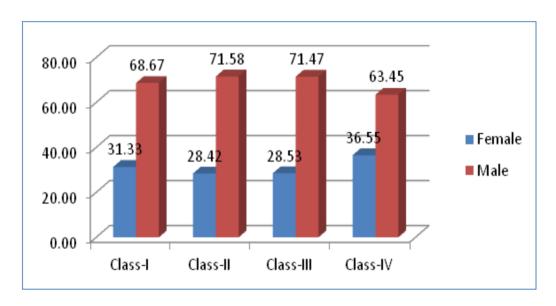
Employment Position of Women

As per Employment Exchange Report, 36.04% of the total registration was women in 2014 which has increased to 37.44 % during 2021. Dimapur District has the highest number of Women Employment registration. (Refer table no. 5.8 & 5.9)

Female Nagaland Government Employees

As per PIMS Report, female employees comprised of only 22.46% of total employees during 2014 which substantially increased to 31.26% in 2021, out of which 31.33%, 28.42%, 28.53% and 36.55% of the female employees falls under the categories of class-I, class-III and class-IV, respectively. 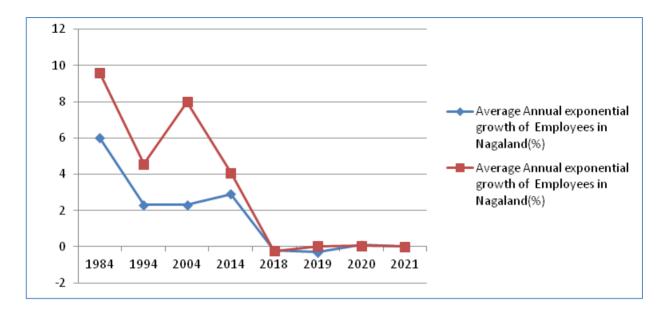
Percentage Distribution of Nagaland Government Employees during 2021

Extracts from Socio Economic and Caste Census (SECC), 2011.

- ➤ During the Socio Economic and Caste Census (SECC), 2011, total of 284310 Rural Households having total population of 1459531 were recorded to extract the Gender Analysis of Households (Rural) in Nagaland. Out of the total population 748983 were male, 710469 were female and 79 were transgender. While out of the 284310 households recorded, 249860 households (88%) were Male Headed and 34434 households (12%) were Female Headed (Refer table 5.19).
- A total of 34434 female headed households (hh) were recorded during the SECC, 2011, out of which 1750 (5%) were landless households deriving major part of their income from manual casual labour, while majority of the rural households, i.e. 26499 (77%) had earning member whose monthly income was less than Rs. 5000 and only 3456 (10%) households had earning member whose monthly income was less than Rs. 10000. It was again observed that out of the 34434 households, 15311 (44%) households owned un-irrigated land, 8223 (24%) owned irrigated land and 10489 (30%) owned other land (Refer table 5.20).

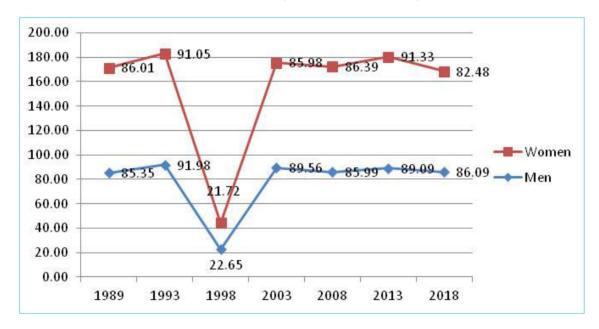
Women Participation in State Assembly Election

Participation of women electors in the State Assembly elections over the years has been very encouraging. During the 3rd State Assembly 1974, women voters were only 77.47% which have increased to 82.48 % in the 13 State Assembly Election (2018). Growth of women participation in the state assembly election from 1989 to 2018 is given in the diagram below. In constituency wise, Southern Angami-II with 53.55 % has the highest percentage of female electors to total electors followed by Southern Angami-I with 52.95 % under kohima district. Phomching under Mon district with 43.66 % has the lowest percentage of female electors to total electors. (Refer table no. 6.1 & 6.5).

Lok Sabha General Election

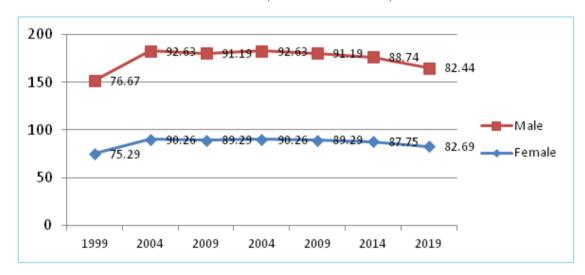
Female participation (voters) in the Lok Sabha election has increased from 60.37 % in the 5th general election (1971) to 82.69% in the 17th general election (2019) as against corresponding male counterpart of 56.82 %(1971) and 82.44 %(2019). The growth of voters turn out from 1999 to 2019 is shown in the diagram below. (Refer table no. 6.3)

Until now, only one woman has contested in the Lok Sabha Election. She contested during the year 1977 & 1980 and got elected during 1977. On the other hand, there were 724 female Contestants during the last Lok Sabha Election 2019 in India, out of which 78 women were elected to the parliament.

agaland is a state that does not conform to the general perception of women status in India. Incidents of dowry deaths, female infanticides and neglect of girl child are absent in Naga culture. However, other form of violence like kidnapping and abduction, wife beating, rape and molestation etc. are on the rise and are being reported in the recent years.

Some Important Findings

Crime against Women

During 2022, 23 cases of crimes against women were registered in Nagaland. Dimapur and Wokha district had the highest number of crimes (7 no. of cases) against women

registered. (Refer table no. 7.1 & 7.2)

As per the report furnished by DGP Nagaland, 35 cases of crimes during 2020 and 34 cases of crimes in 2021 were cleared by the Court. (Refer table no. 7.4)

The figures provided in tables 7.1 to 7.4 for the year 2020 in this publication are the final figures for the corresponding year, while the figures provided during the previous publication were provisional figures.

Women arrested under Special and Local Laws (SLL) by Crime

During 2021-22, 45 women were arrested under special and local laws of which 34 cases were related to NDPS Act, 2 cases under Arms Act and 9 cases under other SLL crimes. Most of the arrested women are in the age group of 30-50. (Refer table no.7.6)

Rape Cases

29 cases of rape were registered during 2021. Most of the victims were in the age group of 14-18 years. (Refer table no. 7.7)

Violence against Women (State Resource for Women)

As per the information furnished by the State Resource for Women, there were 49 critical cases of Domestics Violence, 3 critical cases of rape, 10 critical cases of harassment & cybercrime during 2020-21 in the state. In Dimapur District, cases of domestic violence & prostitution are prominent. (For detail refer table no.7.14& 7.15)

Women Convicts and Remand Prisoners

According to the IGP (Prisons) there were 840 prisoners during 2021-22 out of which 56 prisoners were females. Most of the convicts were in the age group of 21 to 40.(For detail refer table no.7.8)

Physical or sexual violence

During 2021, 12 cases of physical or sexual violence were committed by persons other than an intimate partner. Highest incidents occurred in the district of Tuensang. (For detail refer table no.7.11)

Causes of Suicide Deaths

Suicide cases have been on the rise over the years. In the year 2021, there were 72 cases of suicides, out of which 65 were male and 7 were female. (Refer table no.7.12)

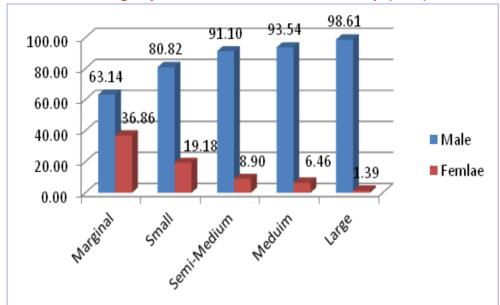

Land Holdings by Size Class

According to the Report on Census of Land Holdings 2015-16, total land holding size of Nagaland is 195874 hectares, out of which total land size holding by women is 19359 hectares (9.88%). Maximum land holding size by women was registered in districts of Kohima & Phek. Women land holding size in various categories are as marginal -2990 ha., small-5695 ha., semi-medium-5623 ha., medium-4754 ha. and large holdings -297 ha. (for detail refer table no.8.1)

Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS)

During 2021-22, there were 432468 registered female workers as against 485010 registered male workers, wherein 291084 females and 457143 males are working under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee scheme. Districts of Dimapur & Kohima have highest female registered work forces. (for detail refer table no.8.2)

Self Help Groups (SHG)

With an aim to achieve social and economic empowerment of women, the state government has adopted 'micro credit' as a tool to extend financial support to these groups. The numbers of SHGs in the state during 2021-22 was 12445. Mon District with 1983 nos. and Phek with 1620 nos. have the

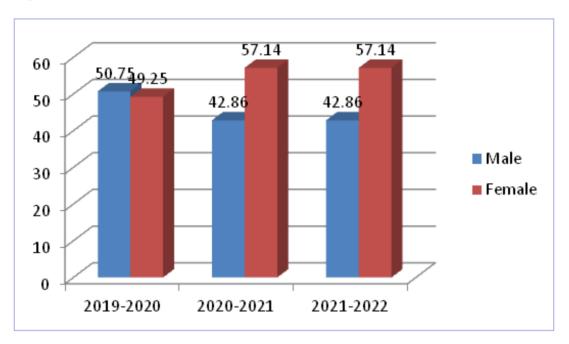
highest number of SHGs. 525 nos. of SHGs have access to Bank Credit. During the same year, Rs. 183.15lakhs was utilized as revolving funds and Rs.2808.17lakhs was utilized as community support Fund. (for detail refer table no.8.3)

Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) & Priority Households (PHH) Scheme

- The main objective of the scheme is to ensure food security and to create hunger-free India. AAY scheme covers the poorest of the poor households. Under AAY Scheme the poorest among the BPL families are selected and issued AAY ration cards. The Scheme initially targeted the 5% of the Population who couldn't have 2 square meals a day.
- As per the information furnished by the Directorate of Food & Civil Supplies around 50.75 percent of male and 49.25 percent of female were benefitted during the year 2019-

20. For the year 2020-21 and 2021-22, the number of beneficiaries remains the same as per the allocation from the Government of India. The percentages of male and female beneficiaries for the stated years were 42.86 & 57.14 respectively. (for detail refer table 8.5)

Percentage Beneficiaries for the AAY & PHH Scheme



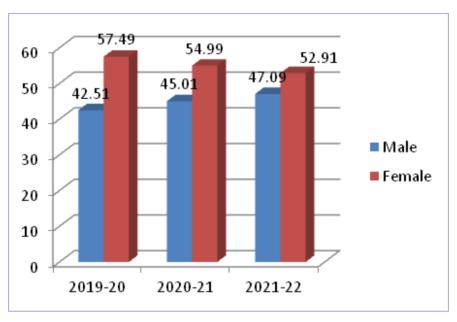
PM-KISAN Scheme

- PM-KISAN or the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana is a Central Sector scheme with 100% funding from Government of India. In Nagaland, PM-KISAN scheme was launched on 25th February 2019. The main objectives of the PM-KISAN scheme is to provide income support to all eligible land-holding farmers and their families. PM-KISAN scheme also aims to supplement the financial needs of the farmers in procuring various inputs to ensure proper crop health and appropriate yields, commensurate with the anticipated farm income.
- Over the years, it is seen that the beneficiaries of women registered under PM Kisan scheme are more than the male beneficiaries as shown in the table below. Out of 214623 beneficiaries registered under PM-KISAN scheme, 113557 are female and 101066 were male during 2021-22. (for detail refer table 8.6)

Definitions And Explanations

Age-Specific Fertility Rate (ASFR)

Age-specific fertility rate is defined as the number of live births in a specific age group of women per thousand female populations of that age group (ORGI).

Age-Specific Mortality Rate (ASMR)

Age-specific mortality rate is defined as the number of deaths in specific age group per thousand populations in the same age-group in a given year (ORGI).

Annual Exponential Growth Rate

r = (Ln P (t+10) - Ln P (t)) / 10

Where Ln stands for natural logarithm

P(t) = Initial population

P(t+10) = Population after 10 years

Anaemia: a condition in which there is a deficiency of red cells or of haemoglobin in the blood, resulting in pallor and weariness.

Antenatal: means relating to the medical care of women when they are expecting a baby.

Birth: Live birth or still birth (ORGI).

Birth Rate: Number of births per 1000 population

Children Ever Born: Children ever born are the number of children born alive during the life

span of the women.

Crude Birth Rate

Number of live births during the year per 1000 population (mid-year)

Crude death rate

Crude death rate (CDR) = $\underline{\text{Number of deaths during the year}}$ x 1000

Mid-year population

Death: Permanent disappearance of all evidence of the life at any time after live birth has taken place (ORGI).

Demography

Demography is defined as the study of the statistics of human populations. The study of the characteristics of human populations, such as size, growth, density, distribution, and vital statistics.

Density of Population: Number of persons per sq. Kms

Dropout Rate:

A dropout is a pupil who leaves school before the completion of a school stage or leaving at some intermediate or non-terminal point of a given level of education.

Dropout at primary stage during a given year is defined as the ratio of the difference of enrolment in class I in the fourth year preceding and the enrolment in class V during the year to the enrolment in the class I in the fourth year preceding. In mathematical terms, these rates for primary (I-V), middle (I-VIII) and secondary (I-X) stages are explained below:

Dropout rate at Primary stage during the year is equal to

<u>Enrolment in class I preceding four years minus Enrolment in class V during the Year</u> * 100

<u>Enrolment in class I preceding four years</u>

Dropout rate at Elementary stage during the year is equal to

Enrolment in class I preceding 7 years minus Enrolment in class VIII during the year * 100

Enrolment in class I preceding 7 years

Dropout rates at Secondary stage during the year is equal to

<u>Enrolment in class I preceding 9 Year minus Enrolment in class X during the year</u> * 100

Enrolment in class I preceding 9 years

Disability

"Person with disability" means a person with long term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairment which, in interaction with barriers, hinders his full and effective participation in society equally with others. "Barrier" means any factor including communicational, cultural, economic, environmental, institutional, political, social, attitudinal or structural factors which hampers the full and effective participation of persons with disabilities in society (NSS 76thRound).

Effective Literacy Rate (ELR)

The total percentage of the population of an area at a particular time aged seven year or above who can read and write with understanding. Here the denominator is the population aged seven years or more (ORGI).

Employed and Unemployed

According to usual status approach, (with a reference period of 365 days) adopted by National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) a person in the labour force is considered as working or employed if he/she is engaged relatively for a longer time, during the reference period of last 365 days in any one or more of the work activities. He/she was considered as seeking or available for work or unemployed if he/she was not working but was either seeking or available for work for a relatively longer period of the specified reference period

Ever Married Women: A women who has been married at least once in their lives although their current marital status may not be married.

Expectation of Life at Birth

The expectation of life at birth is the average number of years a person is expected to live under prevailing mortality conditions (ORGI).

Farming: It is the activity of growing crops or keeping animals on a farm. Synonyms: agriculture, cultivation, husbandry, land management More Synonyms of farming.

General Fertility Rate (GFR)

General fertility rate is defined as number of live births per thousand women in the age group (15-49 years) in a given year (ORGI).

Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER)

The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for a class-group is the ratio of the number of persons in the class-group to the number of persons in the corresponding official agegroup (M/o Education).

GER at stage I = Enrolment at stage I * 100

Population in the age group corresponding to the I stage

Two stages are: primary (Classes I-V) and middle (Classes VI-VIII). The corresponding age-group for these stages is 6-10 years and 11-13 years respectively. Therefore, gross enrolment ratio for primary stage (I-V) is

Total Enrolment in Classes I-V *100
Total population in the age group 6-10 years

While interpreting these figures, it should be noted that there may be many students outside the age group 6-10 enrolled in classes I-V. Therefore, gross enrolment ratios in some age groups can be more than 100.

Gender Parity Index (GPI)

The Gender Parity Index (GPI) is the ratio of the number of female students enrolled at primary, secondary and tertiary levels of education to the corresponding number of male student in each level. Thus GPI (based on GER) which is free from the effects of the population structure of the appropriate age group, provides picture of gender equality in education.

Household: A group of persons who normally lives together and takes their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevent any of them from doing so. Infant Death: Death of a child less than one year old (ORGI).

Infant Mortality Rate (IMR)

Infant mortality rate refers to the measurement of mortality in the first year of life and is computed by (relating) the number of deaths under one year of age divided by 1000 live births in a given year (ORGI).

Labour Force

Labour force is defined as the total persons working (or employed) and seeking or available for work (or unemployed

Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR)

LFPR is defined as the percentage of persons in the labour force in the population (PLFS).

 $LFPR = \underline{No. of Employed Persons} + \underline{No. of Unemployed Persons} * 100$ Total Population

Literate

A person aged 7 years and above who can both read and write with understanding in any language was taken as literate. A person, who can only read but cannot write, is not literate. It is not necessary that to be treated as literate, a person should have received any formal education or passed any minimum educational standard. Literacy could also have been achieved through adult literacy classes or through any non-formal educational system. People who are blind and can read in Braille were also treated as literates. All children of age 6 years or less were treated as illiterate by definition, irrespective of their status of school attendance and the capability to read and write.

Literacy rate:

The total percentage of the population of an area at a particular time aged seven years or above who can read and write with understanding. Here the denominator is the population aged seven years or more.

Live birth: Complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which, after such expulsion or extraction, breathes or shows any other evidence of life, and each product of such birth is considered live-born (ORGI).

Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR)

Maternal Mortality Ratio refers to the number of women who die as a result of complications of pregnancy or childbearing in a given year per 100,000 live births in that year (ORGI).

Main Workers: Those workers who had worked for the major part of the reference period (i.e. 6 months or more)

Marginal Workers: Those workers who had not worked for the major part of the reference period (i.e. less than 6 months

Mean Age at Marriage

Singulate mean age at marriage is average age at the first marriage. It is derived by using method of Decade Synthetic Cohort. The method consists of calculating the proportions of single persons in a hypothetical cohort exposed to inter-census first marriage rates. In the next step the person years lived in a single state are derived by summing the proportions for various five years age-groups. This figure is then adjusted for persons who remain unmarried and thus mean age at marriage is derived.

MOVCD: Mission Organic Value Chain Development is a Central Sector Scheme (MOVCD), a sub-mission under National Mission for Sustainable Agriculture (NMSA) for implementation in the North East Region.

NFSM: National Food Security Mission is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme launched by the Government of India in view of the stagnating food grain production and an increasing consumption need of the growing population.

Non-Workers: A person who is not engaged in any gainful activity

Operational Holdings: all land which is used wholly or partly for agricultural production and is operated as one technical unit by one person alone or with others without regard to the title legal form size or location.

Participation rate

Participation rate in a day in any activity is defined as the percentage of persons performing that activity during the 24 hours of the reference period.

Participation rate in activity 'A' = <u>number of persons participiting in activity 'A'</u> *100 total number of person

PM-KISAN: is a Central Sector Scheme with 100% funding from the Government of India.

PMKSY: Pradan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) is being implemented to expand cultivated area with assured irrigation, reduce wastage of water and improve water use efficiency.

Principal Status

The status of activity on which a person spent relatively longer time of the preceding 365 days prior to the date of survey was considered the principal usual activity status of the person.

Proportion Unemployed (PU):

It is defined as the percentage of persons unemployed in the population (PLFS).

PU = <u>No. ofUnemployedPersons</u>*100 Total Population

RAD(NSMA): National Mission for Sustainable Agriculture (NSMA) has been formulated for enhancing agriculture productivity especially in rain-fed areas focusing on integrated farming water use efficiency, soil health management and synergizing resource conservation.

RKVY: Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana Scheme was initiated in 2007 as an umbrella scheme for ensuring holistic development of agriculture and allied sectors.

Rural area

Any administrative area that was not classified as Urban is treated as a rural area.

SMAN: Sub-Mission on Agricultural Mechanism (SMAM) is implemented in every state to promote farm mechanization.

SMSP: Sub-Mission Seed and Planting Material (SMSP) under National Mission on Agricultural Extension and Technology (NMAET) will be implemented.

Subsidiary Status

A 'non-worker' (on the basis of principal usual activity status) who pursued some gainful activity in a subsidiary capacity was considered to be usually working in a subsidiary capacity.

Suicide Rate

Suicide rate is defined as the number of suicides per hundred thousand populations.

Scheduled Commercial Banks

All banks which are included in the Second Schedule to the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 are Scheduled Banks. These banks comprise Scheduled Commercial Banks and Scheduled Cooperative Banks.

Sex Ratio / Gender Ratio

Sex ratio has been defined as the number of females per 1000 males in the population; it is expressed as 'number of females per 1000 males'

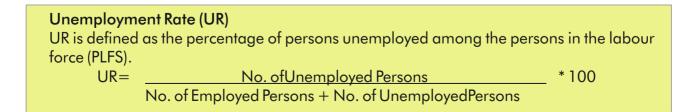
Sex Ratio = $\frac{\text{Number of female}}{\text{Number of males}}$ *1000

Still Birth:

Complete expulsion or extraction of baby from its mother where the fetus does not breathe or show any evidence of life, such as beating of the heart or a cry or movement of the limbs.

Total Fertility Rate

Total fertility rate is defined as the average number of children that would be born to a woman if she experiences the current fertility pattern throughout her reproductive span (15-49 years).



Urban Area

An urban area is defined as follows:

- (a) All statutory towns i.e. all places within a municipality, corporation, municipal board, Cantonment board or notified town area committee etc.
- (b) All other places that satisfy the following criteria:
 - (i) a minimum population of 5,000
 - (ii) at least 75% of male working population engaged in non- agricultural pursuits; and
 - (iii) a density of population of at least 400 persons per square kilometre (1000 per sq. mile). The urban criterion of 1981 varies slightly from that of 1961 and 1971 censuses. In that the males working in activities such as fishing, logging etc. were treated as engaged in non-agricultural activities whereas in 1981 they were treated as on par with cultivators and agricultural labourers. The definition adopted in 1991 census was similar to that of 1981 census.

Worker Population Ratio (WPR)

Worker Population Ratio (WPR) is defined as the percentage of employed persons in the population (PLFS).

WPR = No. of employed Persons * 100 Total population

Work Force

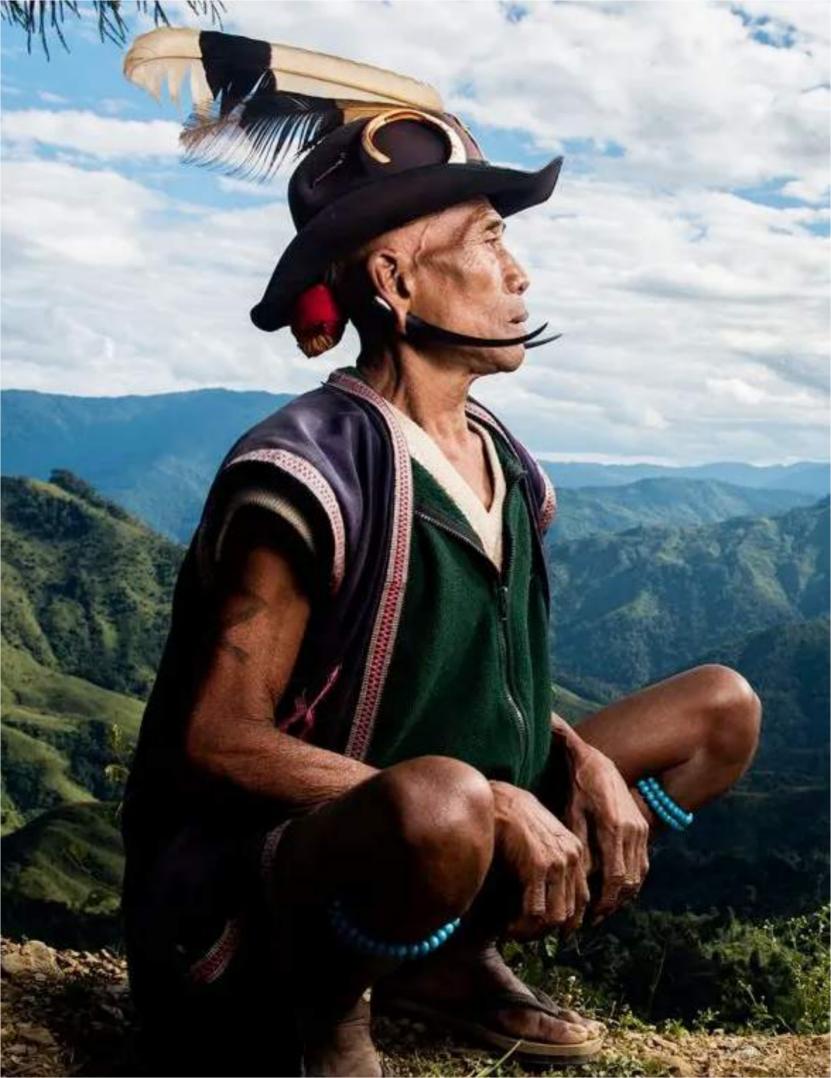
Persons engaged in any gainful activity are considered 'workers' (or employed). They are the persons assigned any one or more of the nine activity categories under the first broad activity category i.e. "working or employed".

Workforce Participation Rate

Workforce participation rate is defined as the proportion of workers in the population.

Youth

Youth are defined as those aged 15 to 29 in the National Youth Policy (2014) (NYP-2014).
